CURRICULUM - WHAT DO WE DO AT SCHOOL



In nursery, we read and share stories with the children to foster a love of reading, language, and imagination. Stories introduce children to new words and ideas, helping them build vocabulary and develop listening skills. Sharing stories also encourages empathy, as children learn about different characters, emotions, and experiences. It's a wonderful way for them to make sense of the world around them and explore their own feelings in a safe and creative way.

To help at home, try making story time a part of your daily routine, such as bedtime stories. Engage your child by asking questions about the story, talking about their favourite characters, or letting them tell part of the story in their own words. You could also borrow story bags from nursery or visit the library together for fresh books and activities. These small moments will encourage a love of reading!


